

CIPES 1ST PHD STUDENT WORKSHOP

The CIPES PhD Student Workshop is an **academic event which seeks to disseminate and improve PhD students' planned, ongoing or recently completed research in the topics of Higher Education and Higher Education Policies**. It is **open to all PhD Students from any institution or nationality** with a thesis on these topics.

This event provides a discussion forum to PhD students in Higher Education from a variety of areas, such as Educational Sciences, Economics, Psychology, Sociology, Public Policy, Political Science or Management. It has the goal of enriching PhD students' research and to provide a networking opportunity for those students among other junior researchers and the senior researchers from CIPES.

The event will be held **at CIPES, in Matosinhos, on the 10th of February**. The workshop will **start at 14:00 and will end at 18:00** maximum, depending on the number of presentations. A small lunch will be offered to all participants starting at 13:00. The workshop can be extended to the morning if needed. The workshop is totally free of charge. **Participating students are expected to send their research contribution in the form of a working paper**. During the workshop, each student will make a 20-minute presentation, followed by a 10-minute review by another participating student. The following 10 minutes will be allocated to a discussion among all participants, promoted by one of CIPES senior researchers. Participants will have access to all papers beforehand and each one will prepare a review on a colleague's paper. At the end of the Workshop, **the board of CIPES will give a "Best Paper" award to one of the participants**, based solely on the evaluation of the papers sent to the workshop.

Papers should be sent to CIPES (cipes@cipes.up.pt) until the **27th of January**. Communication of acceptance to the Workshop and the Workshop Program is until the **3th of February**.

Papers should **not exceed 5000 words**. All types of papers (research plans, literature reviews, quantitative or qualitative research) are encouraged.

Along with your paper, please include an abstract which should not exceed one A4 page format. The page header, before the abstract, should display the title of the paper, followed by the identification of the author, e-mail contact, a short biographical note, name of the Doctoral Programme, and the supervisor(s)' name(s). Abstracts should also include up to five keywords.
